Work Supported

Community Vision began as an organization to support people with disabilities to live in a home of their own. For 33 years, independent housing has been our top priority. As housing prices rose, affordability became a concern. Over the past three years, we developed a way to support people with disabilities to find affordable, independent, and sustainable rentals. Since 2020 we have helped over 40 people find a place to call home. We also provide tenant education and collaborate with affordable housing developers around accessibility and community inclusion.
